



The Old Testament Isaiah 2:1–5

A The Old Testament Reading is from Isaiah, chapter 2.

¹The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem.

²It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the LORD shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be lifted up above the hills; and all the nations shall flow to it,

A The Epistle is from Romans, chapter 13.

⁸Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. ⁹The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." ¹⁰Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.

¹¹Besides this you know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. ¹²The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. ¹³Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling and jealousy. ¹⁴But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.



→ everlasting. Amen.


Lord's Prayer

Preparing for His Coming

One of the great creations of the early church was the creation of a church calendar. To be sure, Judaism preceded Christianity in this specific regard, but we have made massive improvements on the dissemination of this great aid to faith. Did you know that the Season of Advent goes back to the 5th century AD?

The Season of Advent is a wonderful way of preparing to again rehearse that profound event of "God-With-Us" (Allelulia!). But this entails a major struggle in which to stay "on point," as the culture demands that the season be observed in its own selfish self-serving way! No, the reason for the season is not to satisfy your own avaricious wants and desires; it is to prepare your life and yourself for the coming of God into human life and human doings!

Why do we continue to practice this on an annual basis? Because there are coming generations and we are still connected to younger generations who watch us and mimic us (though they would never admit it....) The Season of Advent is a superb time of preparing and creating new aspects of self that we might purposefully and more nearly become the persons whom God called and created us to be....

As I write this column in early November, I am planning some home materials to assist us in using the Season of Advent for faith advancements. I am open to any suggestions or commentary that will assist us in becoming His people....
